CLASS #2-VEGETABLES IS AMATEUR DIVISION, OPEN ONLY TO THOSE WHO DERIVE NO INCOME FROM THEIR PRODUCE. Exhibits must be brought in on **Sunday, August 3rd** from 1:00 pm to 5:00 pm or Monday, August 4th from 1:00 pm thru 7:30 pm. All exhibits must be in place by Monday night by 7:30 pm.

Non-Livestock/Home Economics building will be closed all day Tuesday. Starting on Wednesday the building will be open daily from 10:00 am to 8:30 pm.

Premium checks and exhibits can be picked up in department on Sunday, starting at 3:00 pm until 6:00 pm for both checks and exhibits.
